(SPOKANE, WASH.) – Spokane Public Library will host <u>From Ukraine to Spokane: Stories of Displacement and Resilience</u> on Tuesday, September 12 at 6:30pm at Central Library.

"As Russia's attack on Ukraine displaced countless Ukrainians, Spokane has become a sanctuary for many seeking refuge. This event offers a unique opportunity to hear firsthand accounts of those who experienced the turmoil of leaving their country and the challenges of starting anew in Spokane," said Thrive International Community Engagement Manager Emily Hughes.

Through translated library handouts, website services, workshops, a large collection of Ukrainian and Russian language books, and more, Spokane Public Library has been working hard to ensure its libraries are a welcoming space for individuals new to the country and to Spokane.

"I can't imagine the feelings of despair and fear this community experienced being displaced from their homes and loved ones, and to a country that speaks an entirely different language," said Spokane Public Library Current Affairs Specialist Shane Gronholz. "We partnered with Thrive International right away to connect the newcomers to free library resources. We also worked with Thrive to create a video tour of Central Library in Russian to showcase all of the resources available."
